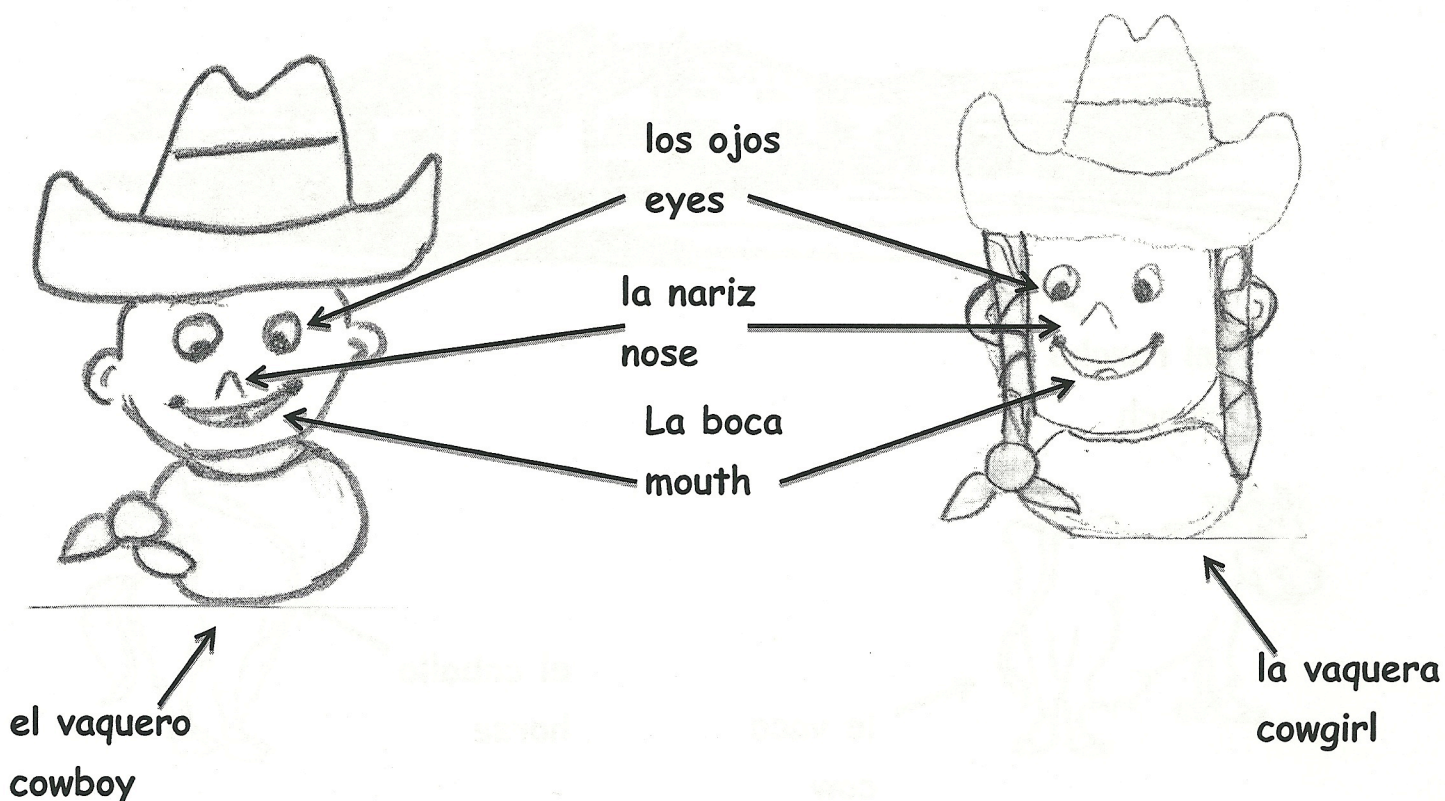

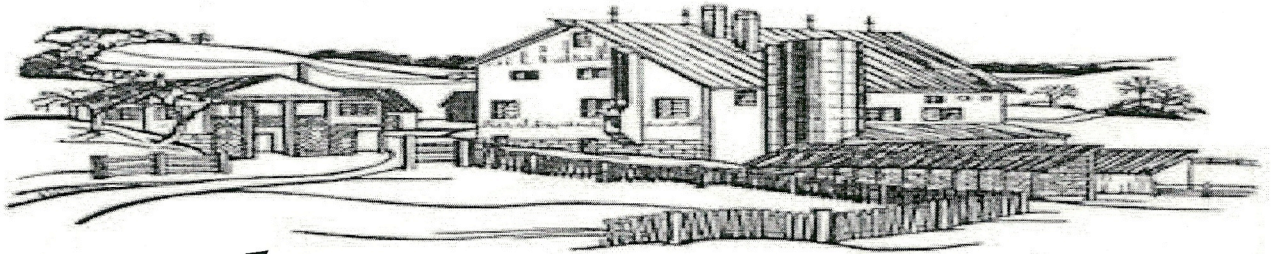
Vaquero y Vaquera Cowboy and Cowgirl

Parents: turn on the radio to a country music station and dance to the music. While dancing, point to your facial parts and say the word in Spanish. Point to your child's facial parts and have your child repeat the word in Spanish.

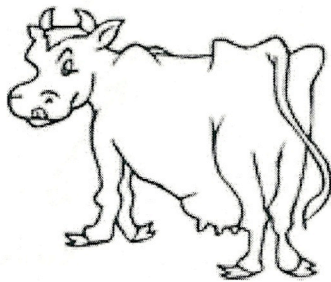
For example: after you point to your nose and say "la nariz", touch his/her nose and help your child say "la nariz".

Also, do this for "los ojos" and "la boca". You can also practice asking your child if he/she is a "vaquero" or a "vaquera."

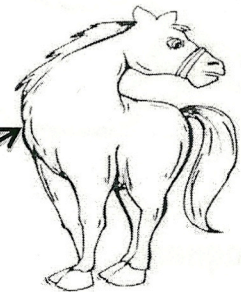
